A Note from the Director...

1971: curtain up on a little rock 'n roll musical by Jim Jacobs and Warren Casey about teenagers navigating life the 1950s.

2025: curtain is still up! *GREASE* has become one the most popular productions of all time, and the 17th longest running Broadway musical. It is still a favorite for regional and community theaters, schools, colleges and summer stock companies across the nation and beyond.

GREASE, set in 1959, follows a group of high schoolers steering their way through senior year. Before our eyes we witness friendships, romances, peer pressure, rebellion, expectations, fitting in, the search for Self, uncovering Identity, acceptance, rejection, trying, failing, cliques, labels, teasing, respect, succeeding, resolving, becoming: moments of life experienced by all of us. How wonderful we have had this opportunity to delve into a piece of theatre that allows us to explore timeless, relatable, accessible, ever-relevant themes!

Although Jacobs and Casey intended *GREASE* to be a simple glimpse into the lives of teenagers in the 1950's, our excavation of the script, story and characters revealed significant, relevant and applicable themes parallelling modern contemporary life today: young people exploring self-expression, young people navigating the balancing of expectation (from self, parents, teachers, friends, society), young people making - (in the words of cherished civil rights activist, John Lewis) "Good Trouble" in an effort to establish a thriving culture of their own and distance themselves from conservative and regulating adults.

Contributing to the creation of this thriving teenage culture, was the developing popularity of rock 'n roll in the 1950s. Venues like dance halls, ballrooms, clubs, and outdoor festivals provided safe spaces for young people from every walk of life to come together and be their truest, most energetic selves. Rock'n Roll was a catalyst in breaking down walls of racial segregation. Historically, music and dance have fostered connection, camaraderie and spirit...and continue to do so today.

Directorially, I wanted to veer away from portraying the familiar *GREASE* characters as 'the usual caricatures' audiences anticipate seeing. My goal was to evolve a fresh storytelling and guide students toward building a 'real world' full of 'real people' with authentic and genuine connections. Our collective hope is - you will grow to know the characters you see on stage and take a vested interest in all their moments together.

I am so proud of our young performing artists and everything they have accomplished – both on stage and off. We have "had us a blast" working and playing together! Thank you for taking this "hydromatic" ride back to 1959 with us!























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About the Authors/Composers

JIM JACOBS (Book, Music and Lyrics). Jacobs, who created Grease (in 1970) with Warren Casey, was born and raised on the mean streets of Chicago's far northwest side. During the golden era of rock 'n' roll (1956-1960) he was a guitar-playing "greaser" student at Taft High School. In 1963, Jacobs met Warren Casey when they were both cast in a local theatre production of A Shot in the Dark. Seven years later they wrote what was to become one of the greatest musicals of all time. Grease opened in 1971 in a former trolley barn called the Kingston Mines Theatre in Chicago. A year later, Grease made it to Broadway and "Greasemania" took off, resulting in one of the longest running shows in Broadway history. The 1978 movie became and remains the highest grossing movie musical of all time. Originally an actor, Jacobs has been seen on television, in motion pictures, regional theatre, national tours, and on Broadway. He is the co-author of several other plays and musicals including Island of Lost Coeds, a musical spoof of the low budget sci-fi/horror/jungle movies of the 1950s, which he wrote with Warren Casey. In May 2014, Mr. Jacobs was presented with an honorary doctorate degree from Columbia College in Chicago. He currently resides in Southern California and remains active in the theatre, especially with the American Theatre Company of Chicago.

WARREN CASEY (Author, Composer and Lyricist) was born in Yonkers, New York, and attended Syracuse University. During the late '50s, he learned all about "greasers" while working as an art teacher in upstate New York. He moved to Chicago in 1962, where he hoped to pursue an acting career. He appeared in dozens of productions, including creating the role of Bernie Litko in David Mamet's Sexual Perversity in Chicago. He supported himself with jobs in retail, including working as an assistant manager of a chain of apparel stores, and as a record salesman. In the meantime, he taught himself how to play the guitar and began writing songs. Mr. Casey acted with the Chicago Stage Guild (where he met Jim Jacobs), the Old Town Players, and the Kingston Mines Theatre. The latter company staged the original production of GREASE which he wrote with Jim Jacobs. After the incredible success of both the musical and the movie, the two collaborated on Island of Lost Coeds, a musical satire of the B-movies of the 1950s. Mr. Casey died in 1988.
